The Community is invited to attend a Public Meeting on September 10, 2015, 6-8 PM, at the Pacifica Community Center Auditorium at 540 Crespi Drive in Pacifica, to learn about the planned Pedro Point Headlands (PPH) Restoration and Trail Project. The meeting will be hosted by the Pacifica Land Trust, a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving open space lands for current and future generations.

The goals of this project are to:

- Fill and eliminate existing gullies and other erosion issues from past off-highway vehicle use;
- Re-establish the natural topography and drainage in highly eroded areas;
- Restore disturbed trails and gullies to Coastal Prairie and Coastal Scrub vegetation;
- With the help of volunteer stewards, propagate and salvage native plants; and
- Re-build and restore safe, sustainable pedestrian trails.

Design and planning of the PPH Restoration and Trail Project are underway, with the construction documents and permits to be completed by summer 2016. At the public meeting, the Pacifica Land Trust, its consultants and partners will describe and take public feedback on the progress to-date in assessing the current conditions and preferred solutions to reducing erosion, restoring natural water flow and repairing the pedestrian trail system.

The Pedro Point Headlands are public lands, currently owned by the California Coastal Conservancy and the City of Pacifica. The Pacifica Land Trust provides stewardship for the property. Ownership of the headlands is expected to transfer to San Mateo County by the end of 2015.

The PPH Restoration and Trail Project is supported by California State Parks Division of Off-Highway Vehicle Recreation, California Coastal Conservancy and the County of San Mateo.
